## How can you choose the right dog?

There are currently over 300 dog breeds, from which you can choose the most suitable friend.

But you have to know that every breed has its own needs: shelter, food, physical activity, care.



**For example:** A large dog will need more space and food than a small dog.

**Very important is how much time you can spend with your dog every day.**

It is advisable to consult a specialist, specialized breeder, who will guide you to the best choice.

**And now ???**

**Be a responsible owner !!!**



Take your dog to the vet!



Ensure it a healthy and balanced diet!

Teach your dog to be obedient!

Identify your dog by microchip and platelet

## **Why would you go to the vet ?**

He can provide you with all the information and treatments you need to keep your pet healthy.

From the age of 6 weeks, all dogs must be taken regularly to the veterinarian for registration, deworming, vaccination and to receive the health card.

**Why?** A sick dog is a risk to your health and your family. Your dog can transmit serious disease such as RABIES to humans that can be easily prevented by going to your veterinarian on time.



## **What does a healthy and balanced diet mean?**



The dog is a carnivorous animal, and its feeding is different from that of the human.

What can you give your dog to eat?



Dried food

Wet food

Food specially prepared for dogs



**Your dog must have  
permanent access to fresh  
water**



## What can you teach your dog?



Take the dog out as often as possible.

They, as they are young, need a special place, where they can do their business, until they get used to a program.

Reward your dog every time it does its business at a stated place, give it a snack to its liking and play with him to know that it did a good job.

Do not punish your dog if he did its business in a place other than the one you choose.





**Animals do not understand the punishments after the deed has been committed.**

As they grow up, they learn to do their business during walks (at least 2 times a day).

### How does it become an educated dog?

The basic commands that every dog must learn and follow are:



-  Stay!
-  Sit!
-  Come here!
-  No!



With a lot of patience and exercise you can have a well-educated dog that does not disturb the others.

If you need help, you can go to a training school, where your dog will learn to be exemplary.

It is best to repeat a command and reward the puppy only when executing it.

### Important !!!

Do not hit it or scream at it when it does not execute the commands.

## IDENTIFYING YOUR DOG IS MANDATORY

Identification is made at the vet by implanting a microchip (Transponder), which contains a unique code. By this identification the dog will be officially part of your family.

This code is registered in a database of dogs with owner. The dogs from Câmpia Turzii are also registered in the **R.E.A.D.C.** database.

The microchip is very useful in case of animal's loss or theft.

To identify the transponder (the microchip), a portable scanner is needed, which is owned only by vets.

By simply scanning it, the unique code is obtained, which certifies that the dog belongs to an owner.

Upon registration, **R.E.A.D.C.** also offers an optical reflective plate (medallion) for the dog's collar, which is easily seen from a distance and helps to distinguish between a dog with owner, which is vaccinated, and one without owner, possibly a disease carrier.

**The plate symbolizes:**

**Warning !!! This dog has an owner !!!**





## THE IMPORTANCE OF THE REFLECTIVE OPTICAL PLATELET

It offers all the information you need:



- The telephone number of the R.E.A.D.C. call center where you need to call
- The dog series registered in the **R.E.A.D.C.** database

**The orange color of the reflective plate makes the visualization and recognition possible even late at night, in the light of the headlights or lantern, thus avoiding possible road accidents.**



**The first contact someone has with an animal is the visual one, which is why the visible plate on your dog's collar sends the following message to anyone who sees it:**

- ! it is vaccinated
- ! it has an owner who loves it
- ! I don't have to be afraid
- ! I don't have to be aggressive
- ! if it is unaccompanied it means that it is lost and someone is definitely looking for it.



### **It must be recovered! HOW ???**

I call the telephone number of the R.E.A.D.C. call center – written on the plate, where I communicate the platelet series, in order to identify the dog, as well as the place where I found the dog.

The representatives the R.E.A.D.C. Association will contact the owner of the found dog to retrieve it!

**The platelet avoids the capture of the animal by the flyers, its mistreatment and the unnecessary transport to the pound.**



## Useful advice:

- 🦷 If you want a dog, talk to your parents and family first.
- 🦷 We advise you to get your dog from an authorized breeder or shelter, after the age of 8 weeks.
- 🦷 Draw your dog's attention with toys.
- 🦷 Arrange a space for your dog.  
It needs some peace too.
- 🦷 Maintain your dog's cleanliness and remove the dirt around it.
- 🦷 Any problem you have with it, consult a specialist.
- 🦷 Get your dog used to socializing with other animals as well as with other people.
- 🦷 **DON'T yell at the dog, DON'T whisper it , and DON'T hit it!**
- 🦷 We recommend spaying/neutering your animal, in order to reduce the uncontrolled breeding and abandon



## PREVENTION IS MORE EFFICIENT AND CHEAPER THAN COMBATING!

### What is RABIES ?

Rabies is a very serious disease caused by a virus.

This disease affects the brain.

It is usually transmitted from animal to animal, but can also be transmitted from animal to human.

### How do animals contact this disease?

The rabies virus (a microbe so small that it can only be seen under a microscope, is found in the saliva of sick animals) is transmitted from animals to humans through bites or scratches.



## How does an animal behave when it has RABIES ?

It is very likely that an animal to be infected with rabies if it has the following symptoms:

- wild animals enter in people's households without fear
- pets become restless, aggressive or change their behavior
- nocturnal animals become active during the day
- excessive salivation
- consumption of products and substances unsuitable for them
- paralysis, which can sometimes be the only sign
- fear of the water

Even when an animal looks healthy, it can be infected with RABIES.

## How can we protect ourselves and our beloved animals from RABIES?

If you are bitten or scratched by an animal sick of RABIES, there is a risk of infection with this virus, which not treated urgently, can lead to death.

In this case you must wash yourself with soap and water, notify an adult and go to the doctor urgently.

Vaccination is the most effective way to stop the infection from spreading.

In order to prevent RABIES, infected people should be treated before any symptoms develop.

**Make sure your beloved animal is vaccinated against rabies.**

**Stay away from wild animals or animals you do not know.**

**Do not approach deceased animals as the risk of infection is very high. The virus survives for up to 45 days after their death.**

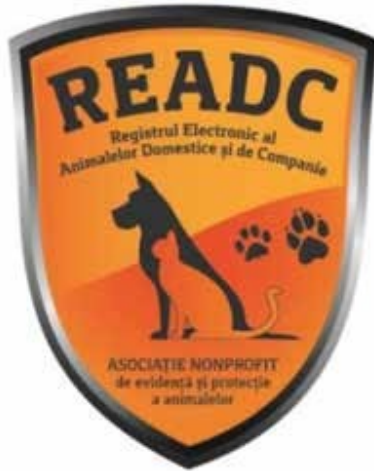
